Welcome from our new Chairman Adam O'Neill

First I would like to say thank you to all who came along to the AGM, and a very big thank you to outgoing Chairman Peter Walpole for his excellent work in moving the Guild along and continuing the good work in all that the Guild does, along with an impressive number of new members.

When I was asked to consider taking over from Peter, I thought about the Guild and what it represents.

The society of British Film Directors and Designers was founded in 1946, became the Guild of Film Art Directors and then from 1982 became the British Film Designers Guild. It was great to see at the AGM the whole range of people from affiliate members just starting out in Film and TV art departments to someone who started his professional career in 1947, and is still contributing to meetings, Peter Lamont. In this newsletter we are also highlighting those just starting out in the industry in the shape of recent graduates from our sponsors Nottingham Trent University, The National Film and Television School and South Wales University.

We have recently considered changing the name of the Guild, which caused more excitement among the committee and members than I would have thought possible. What this showed is that people have strong feelings about the identity of the Guild. In the end it became

clear that there were as many people in favour of changing the name as there were in keeping the name, along with the history and provenance that goes with it. What became apparent is that further uncertainty would be a huge distraction to the work of the Guild, so it has been decided to add a strap line to the existing name to get our message across. The Guild stands for 'Promoting Excellence in Film and Television Art Departments', which we plan to add as a strap line to our logo unless anyone can improve on this... the message is intended to show that whether you work in film, TV drama, TV LE, International TV series, commercials or content, if you believe in doing work to the best possible standard, then the Guild is for you. Committee meetings are open for any member to come along and see what we do, just tell the office you are coming and then turn up.

So, what is the Guild and what have they ever done for us? Well, now that the BECTU art department branch is here, we have largely passed over to them issues of pay and conditions. Former Chairman Simon Bowles was instrumental in composing a pay rate card, which didn't exist before, in response to BFDG members' concerns. It was a tricky job, but has been welcomed by everyone as a useful guideline in negotiations, and has been very good for fielding the many jobs that come through the Guild, as our policy is not to advertise those that don't conform to the card. How do we promote excellence? Firstly, through the requirement that you should have 5 credits in your level. Does this mean you can't jump straight in to a job at a higher level - No! By all means jump in, but make sure you have the skills to deliver. Secondly, through our awards, which are becoming an annual fixture, recognising the best work in the Film and TV world. Thirdly, through portfolio surgeries for people starting out, and evenings with production designers for everyone to learn something new. Our recent evening with Eve Stewart and Jon Bunker was a great success, two designers who had entirely different design processes, and who gave a fascinating glimpse into their individual approach to production design, along with some very good advice.

So why join the Guild? Why be a member, or stay as a member? Firstly, there are many jobs that come through the Guild office. These include everything from Art Department Assistant to Production Designer. There is the ever improving availability list when you are looking for the next job, events, website to promote your work (with a new improved website coming soon) networking events, product discounts and insurance. We have many well established production designers who are members, along with members representing every grade in the art department. There are of course regular film screenings for free and, as someone I know is fond of pointing out, your membership fee is entirely tax

deductible, making membership effectively free! We will be holding an informal drinks event at The Coach and Horses in Soho on 2ndAugust from 7.30pm, it would be great to see you there....

"It's fair to argue the UK has the most talented artists and crews in the world" by Gareth Edwards, filmmaker



To be honest, 'A long time ago, in a galaxy far, far away' is a very misleading opening statement. As a kid, *Star Wars* completely blew my mind, and I would have given anything to have gone into space and joined the Rebel Alliance with Luke and Leia. Sadly, someone eventually explained to me that those people and places don't actually exist; it was all one big illusion they called 'filmmaking'. So, I thought, the second-best option was to go and make films myself.

The question was, how the hell do I do that? I had heard of Hollywood, but I lived in a small town in central England; this wasn't really something we did over here, was it? But, as I slowly consumed every 'behind the scenes' book or magazine I could get my hands on, something else blew my mind: *Star Wars*, and so many of the other films that inspired me and my generation, was actually shot in the UK. This didn't make sense. What was so special about this tiny island? Several years later, through some sheer cosmic fluke (and several Lottery grants), I actually got to make my own *Star Wars* film, and the answer became incredibly clear.

The question was, how the hell do I do that? I had heard of Hollywood, but I lived in a small town in central England; this wasn't really something we did over here, was it?

Simply put, it's fair to argue that the UK has the most talented artists and crews in the whole world. And they are the nicest people you will ever meet, like one big family. Sometimes literally. For instance, I wanted one of the planets in *Rogue One* to look like the dark, rainy world from *Aliens*, which also shot in the UK. Neil Lamont, our production designer, smiled when I mentioned this: his dad, Peter, was one of the creative geniuses behind *Aliens*, and had passed on all his tricks to Neil! And the connections didn't stop there. The father of our second assistant director, who had to shoot the X-wing pilots, also did that very same job on *Star Wars*: *A New Hope*. It soon became clear we were benefiting from generations of exceptional experience, gained making some of the greatest films in cinema history.

So, next time you watch that iconic blue text fade up, remember all that magic was not created in a galaxy far, far away, but very much within reach. But, to be to George Lucas, opening *Star Wars* with, 'A few months ago, just off the M25...' doesn't quite have the same ring. Original article appeared in UK In Focus Magazine



This led me to NFTS, where I continued to hone my skills and understand how I might apply them within the industry.


