



THE CROWN AND SUSTAINABLE DESIGN


There's a healthy philosophy in Italian cuisine: there is no such thing as leftovers, only a never-ending meal. In other words, nothing gets chucked, everything makes a contribution to the next meal and/or the one after. (How else could arancini have become a thing?)

From the beginning we made a decision to apply the never-ending rule to *The Crown*. With up to a dozen different directors using any or all of the sets over time, it was a given that each would seek out their own way to use them. With an average of around 40 sets per episode, 30 of them new to the show, each set was designed to be as futureproof as could be, able to be turned at short notice into whatever later scripts might demand. In a rare case of win-win the creative approach not only went hand-in-hand with the ethical approach, the two became the same approach.

Of course, back in 2014 we didn't know how much future we needed to proof. We threw ourselves into the deep end with something unprecedented: not so much a revamp as a prevamp. Knowing that whatever happened with the commissioning of further seasons we would always need the Queen's private apartments. They were designed in such a way that they could begin life as the Villa Windsor in Paris, then have their windows and our furniture switched to make the channel crossing to Buckingham Palace. The Queen's apartments would then later spend an episode as Diana's Buckingham Palace private apartment. A precedent was set.


Thus in a twist of history, a king who was never crowned would share the Queen's bedroom with a never-to-be future queen, with no-one - until now - the wiser. In another twist, seasons later, Dodi Fayed's fiancé will be living in a chic Parisian apartment that was once Queen Mary's breakfast room, itself having once been a clubhouse at Windsor Polo Ground and much more beside, soon after to become a tartan- rich study in Balmoral. And (tell no-one) no matter who they were or where they were flying to, everyone in *The Crown* went to Stage 6, Elstree Studios, and caught the same plane.

THE BUCKINGHAM PALACE SET MODEL



Over the six Seasons of *The Crown*, eight of the original built spaces were turned into 110 different sets.

The Stage 1 Composite Buckingham Palace set alone was revamped over 40 times and the Plane Fuselage was reincarnated 38 times.

SUSTAINABILITY WITHIN THE SET DEC DEPARTMENT: PROPS









The dressing, when not hired, was sourced from Auctions, Antique Shops, Charity shops, Ebay and Etsy. Much of the furniture, drapes etc. was sold onto existing Hire Companies to be recycled through the Film & TV industry. All packaging material used by the Prop Department was recyclable.

Leftbank partnered with **Bonhams** to auction for charity the best, most interesting Props and Costumes. This has been 8 months of work, the proceeds to go to establishing **The National Film School Scholarship** to financially help the next generation of Film Makers.

At the end of Filming - The Production Team, Set Dec and Props Team spent 6 months recycling and rehoming everything - to multiple Charities, Educational charities, Theatre Groups, other TV Productions, Salvage Architectural yards, Textile Recycling.

There was a real commitment on every level to avoid anything going in a skip.

Destinations for the dispersement of the assets included:

- Women's Refuges
- 'Sharing and Giving' Homeless Charities
- Copped Hall Charitable Trust which took all the old books to resell to help restore its Historic Building
- The British Heart Foundation took a large quantity of furniture and small items
- Charity Shops took boxes of china, glassware
- South Thames College Group for Adult and Community Learning, Youth Training Employment and Skills took the spare rolls of fabric and period chairs to learn Upholstery Techniques
- The Questors Theatre in Ealing took fabric stage drapes and furniture for use in future productions
- Seven other Lower Budget Productions were helped by buying from the Prop Stock at 20 -30% of the original cost

WORKING WITH GREENSHOOT & THE GREEN SCREEN PLATFORM



From Season 1 of *The Crown* Lef Bank Pictures worked alongside Greenshoot with their Green Screen environmental production platform to develop sustainable best practice.

They helped us focus on elements as diverse as minimal set builds and the reuse of construction materials through to the more considered use of printers, setting them to double-sided printing to minimise paper waste. These are some of the areas where they made an impact:

Net zero fuel and travel accounts Seasons 1-5

The total carbon emissions emitted from fuel and travel during the production of Seasons 1-5 was calculated. The total for each season was then offset through the UN REDD+ programme, which invests in sustainability projects around the world, including the Amazon and the UK.

Net Zero production for Season 6

Left Bank Pictures and *The Crown* Season 6 increased their stakeholder and supply chain engagement over the six seasons, raising commitment to their environmental and sustainability programme. The total carbon emissions emitted for Season 6 will be offset in its entirety leading to the first High-End TV Net Zero Production.

190 new entrants trained through the Equal Access Network

New entrants to production were trained in sustainable production practices, aligned with Left Bank's core principles of sustainable development.

Green Diesel: Fuel and Generators Fit for Purpose

Tim Benson from Smart Power and his team ran an innovative industry pilot scheme on S4 and S5 of The Crown to assess fuel efficiency across the production's generators at unit base. This report led to Unit base facilities changing from traditional diesel to Green (HVO) Diesel with a saving of 90% in carbon emissions realised in Season 6.


Innovation in supply chain management over The Crown Seasons:

We worked across suppliers and stakeholders of The Crown, Seasons 1 - 6 to reduce environmental impacts and support new innovations. Highlights include: new eco flooring, composting programmes, new recycling programmes, new ethical suppliers, and of course the new Green diesel suppliers, reducing the production fuel carbon footprint by 90%.

Waste and Recycling:

Greenshoot supported the supply chain on Left Bank's productions to establish and promote innovation within their processes. By working with key suppliers like Locations One we enabled them to invest in new sustainable programmes like their recycling pod system on *The Crown*. This offered increased efficiency, using a dry mixed recycling programme as the cleanest, most efficient process for film sets that have restricted space and time.
